

**Your group want to blockade until the bitter end with or without others – some of you are locked-on to a concrete filled wheelie bin. The rest are providing support. You mean business**

**Your group feel it's important to make a statement. But you think that has already been achieved and advocate moving before there's a serious risk of arrest**

**Your group want to support the blockade, but really don't want to risk arrest. Your pre-agreed policy is to move as soon as asked by the police. So you have already moved away from the gates**

**Your group want to remain as long as possible but feel that there's a need for a critical mass. Rather than too few people remaining, you'd prefer to call a dignified end to the blockade and all leave together**

**Your group are legal observers. You will stay in place as long as there are blockaders at risk of arrest, and the police allow you to do so. You're at the meeting to stay informed so that you can make the necessary preparation**

**Your group are musicians and street actors who have come to add some creativity and colour to the blockade. You have a PA system and lots of papier maché props that you don't want to be damaged. Some of the group are happy to rejoin the blockade once your equipment is moved to safety**

**Your group have no firm feelings. You're not experienced blockaders but came committed to take part for the duration. You are open to hearing from more experienced activists about what's best**
